The course clues are permanent things such as fire hydrants, business phone numbers, school crossing numbers, bus stop IDs, sculptures in front gardens, weird letterboxes, etc. Participants are allocated teams which consist of 2 to 5 people and meet at their designated meeting point at 10.15am on the first and third Fridays of the month.

For the month of July (Fridays 2 & 16 July 2021) David and his wife Glenys, have selected the flatter streets and parks of Lysterfield for their walks – starting/finishing in Lakesfield Reserve with a cuppa afterwards at Kelletts Cafe.
